Exalta Health Board Member, Treasurer

Francisco Calderon is Vice President, Business Intelligence for Family Promise of Grand Rapids, a nonprofit that works to help families experiencing homelessness. He's also in his second year on the Exalta Health board. And he sees strong parallels between the two organizations.

"Our goal (at Family Promise) is to get these families off the streets tonight," he said. "But beyond that we work to provide prevention services before families reach crisis and stabilization programs once they have secured housing to ensure they remain independent. Exalta Health can serve people in crisis but is also working to help people avoid the crisis, be that medical, dental or even spiritual."

Calderon added that both his day-to-day work and his service on the Exalta Health board share another similarity: they help satisfy his deep desire to make a difference in West Michigan.

"Giving back to the community is a huge component of who I am," he said simply. "What can I do to help?"



Born in Managua, Nicaragua, and raised in Cincinnati, Ohio, he was taught from a young age about what it meant to give back, and, he added, what it meant to "do the next right thing."

"My parents made the decision when I was 11 years old to move to the States," he said. "And they had a What Would Jesus Do approach to life."

Recruited to the Exalta board by former Amway colleague and current Exalta president Ed Postma, Francisco admitted he "did his due diligence" before accepting Ed's offer.

"I didn't really know anything about it," he recalled with a smile. "As a data and analytics guy, I had to do my research."

He liked what he found.

"Being Latino and being very aware of the challenges the Latino population faces in West Michigan, I was pleased to see that Exalta serves so many Latino families, including children. I'm very proud of that and proud to be part of an organization willing to provide the services we do to anyone in need.
